PURPOSE: This strategy helps students learn meanings of academic words. These words are not found only one discipline, and students will encounter them often.

Strategy 5 Instructions – Academic Words

- 1. Select a few key words that can used during a lesson.
- 2. Use these words in conjunction with a known word or phrase.
 - Example: We are going to CONCLUDE or END this lesson. Use the words together a few times and then eliminate the word END.
- 3. Expand the use of the new vocabulary word to other parts of speech: CONCLUSION, CONCLUDING
- 4. Encourage the student to use the academic word during discussion.
- 5. Be sure to teach these in context, not in isolation, so students know how to apply the new word. Using words from homework assignments provides a strong context.

For a reference to identify additional academic words that students might need in their classes read the handout, "High-Incidence Academic Word List (AWL)." The words are listed in alphabetical order. Each word has a number. The number "1" indicates the words used with the highest frequency.
