**PURPOSE:** The strategy activates students' prior knowledge of the topic. If students are learning about the topic, select an idea related to the topic that they know (see examples below).

## **Strategy 5 Instructions for Using a K-W-L-S Chart**

## **BEFORE READING**

What I Know: Select topic: Something that the student knows about. For example,

- a. if reading about the Plague, ask what the student knows about Being Sick.
- b. if reading about Strikes, ask what the student knows about Standing up for Others/Self.
- c. if reading about Tokyo, ask what the student knows about Big Cities (NYC).

Then fill out the first column with student's answers.

**What I Want to Know**: Explain that the story/text is about, for example, people are very sick. Then ask, what do you want to know about the topic, for example, being sick with the plague?

## **AFTER READING**

What I Learned: Ask student what he/she learned.

What I Still Want to Know: Ask student what he/she still wants to know about the topic.
