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

# English Language Arts (ELA) Tip

For years, while reading stories, I struggled to comprehend what I was reading. I learned, on my own, to follow the character's actions. This one shift in focus changed the meanings of stories for me. I have found that some students read sentence after sentence, and like me, do not gather meaningful information from the story!

 On the NYS-MEP website, as part of The Reading Comprehension Series in our On Demand PD library, find <u>READING COMPREHENSION OF LITERATURE:</u> <u>CHARACTERIZATION.</u> This module provides strategies for reading literature and paying attention to the story's character.

#### Free Math Flashcards from K5 Learning

Math facts are part of each student's "Math Fluency." Flashcards make review more like a game.

*Note:* K5 Learning currently offers many math worksheets free of charge. They also have membership benefits that you can purchase for a year.

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# Load the Trucks with Stones!

## Trucks Play Dough Math Mats from PreKinders

Download all ten PDF mats from <u>PreKinders</u>, each with a different number and color. You can also choose to download the Trucks "Toddler" mat, with just one truck and no numbers, so you can adapt the game to your students.

For example, the child can select a card or roll one die to discover how many "stones" to make or draw. A different student could roll two dice to count, add, or multiply to discover how many stones to make.

Note: Most of the PreKinders resources are free, with or without a subscription. Resources requiring payment are clearly marked. Subscribing to PreKinders is not necessary to use the website but a choice for you to join their email list. Some Educators find the one to two emails a month useful for their seasonal ideas.

# What Families Need to Know before School Starts

## Which students need a school physical this year?

Physicals: The <u>Required New York State Health Examination Form</u> was updated in May 2023. The New York State Education Department (NYSED) requires a physical exam for

- New entrants; and
- Students entering Grades Pre-K or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11.

Physical exams are required annually for interscholastic sports.

## Which immunizations are needed this year?

Immunizations: The <u>2023-24 School Year New York State Immunization Requirements for School</u> <u>Entrance/Attendance</u> identifies the specific number of doses and immunization differences between the various grade levels, Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12.
