The NYS-MEP SST consists of members from various programs: NYS-MEP Identification & Recruitment (ID&R), NYS-MEP Technical Assistance Support Center (TASC), and the State Education Department Office of ESSA-Funded Programs. Together, we support the eight METS program centers around the state with data and technical assistance, recruitment and student referrals, resources and funding allocations, summer programming, scholarship administration, professional development, and much more.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT and LEARNING COMMUNITIES



The NYS-MEP Technical Assistance Support Center offers ongoing professional development (PD) and learning community opportunities. How do you stay in the loop? Check the NYS-MEP website for current events and an archive of previous workshops/resources. NYS-MEP staff receive periodic newsletters from SST, and you can find out about PD and peer support groups from your director as well!

- <u>Live PD</u> Read about live workshop offerings, specific to serving the migrant population, and register online.
- <u>Archive</u> All in one place, find continual access to resources and recordings from workshops gone by.
- On-Demand Access professional development modules designed to use in either a
 group or independent learning setting. For individuals, users can access the module
 materials; as such, take control of their own learning at a time and place that suits them.
 Module materials include a facilitator guide, video link (if applicable), workshop
 handouts, and additional resources where appropriate. The detailed facilitator guide
 contains instructions for managing the videos and engaging activity suggestions.
- Learning Communities (LC) Periodically connect with NYS-MEP peers who work with the same sub-population(s) that you do! Ask your Director about joining one of the LCs facilitated by SST. Current options include Out of School Youth (OSY), Adolescents, Early Childhood, ELA, Math, and Data. Joining a group is a great way to stay connected, bounce ideas, learn new tricks, and occasionally hear a guest speaker who is an expert in the field.


