TERMS

Phoneme: Smallest unit of speech

Phonemic Awareness: Ability to hear, identify, move or changes sounds

(phonemes) in spoken words

Alphabetic Principle: The idea that letters and letter patterns represent the sounds

of spoken language

Grapheme: Individual letters or groups of letters that represent individual speech

sounds (ex. "ch" or "igh" in "light")

Phoneme-Grapheme Correspondence: How graphemes map to phonemes

Decode: The ability to apply knowledge of letter-sound relationships to correctly

pronounce written words

Encode: An understanding of phonics is used to build or spell a word

Orthography: The writing system of a language

Phonics: The systematic relationship between letters and sounds

Syllable: Part of a word that contains a single vowel sound

Morpheme: The smallest meaningful unit of language
